Writing Postcards to Voters Works


September 25, 2024

This afternoon, from 3:30 to 4:00 p.m., I had the amazing opportunity to spend half an hour with several hundred people who were in hour 22 of a 24-hour marathon postcard writing session. The event, formally known as **24 Hours in '24 Our Freedoms Are On The Ballot Postcard Around The Clock 3.0,** was a huge success.



The event kicked off yesterday, Monday, at 7:30 p.m. with Speaker Emerita Nancy Pelosi. The idea was to keep the participants going with constant stream of interesting conversations so they could write POSTCARDS. I'm told some of the participants pulled an all-nighter. By the time they finish up tonight, they'll have visited with DNC Chair Jaime Harrison. Heather Cox Richardson, Senator Elizabeth Warren, and so many more!

The joy is definitely back in politics.



Writing Postcards to Voters Works (cont'd)

Three groups of activists who put the event together, Downtown Nasty Women Social Group, Markers For Democracy, and Team Min, have been working together since the start of the Trump presidency. The groups were founded in the aftermath of the 2016 election and the January 2017 Women's March. They've been writing postcards to voters since 2017 and have written so many postcards that they stopped counting several hundred thousand postcards ago.

Something that I love about these people is that they write postcards for races up and down the ballot, and they write all year round to make sure they focus attention on special elections and other elections that don't happen in November. They described the current moment we're in as "like tax season but for postcard writers."

My connection with these lovely people started with knitters. A knitter friend connected me with Julie Kern, one of the organizers for this event. Julie and I are best friends now because we've both knit this hat. This is how being a knitter works; I don't make the rules.

Knitters are also very effective political organizers as you can see.

interested in writing you're postcards, there is a lot of information online. You can find Markers For Democracy here. The website has lots of information, including postcarding section, and from there, can you sign up and get involved. Data suggests postcards make difference in voter turnout.

The Blue Wave Cocktail (Serves 1)

What You'll Need:

2 ounces tequila

Strain into a glass over ice, write postcards and save democracy.


Thank you Marissa!



General Meeting Minutes 09-25-2024

Willow Valley Dems Plus General Meeting September 25, 2024

President Jen Porter opened the meeting at 10:05 and introduced guest speakers, three Democratic candidates running for office in the November 5 general election.

Bob Rudy: candidate for PA State House District 97

Mr. Rudy gave three reasons for his decision to run against incumbent Republican Steve Mentzer:

- Failure of gun safety legislation and rise of gun violence
- Failure to ensure equal rights for all citizens, especially women, seniors, and children.
- Threats to public education by charter schools which drain revenue from public schools and the heavy reliance on property taxes to support public schools that leads to inequality

Mr. Rudy promises to work across the aisle in resolving problems in all areas.

Trex Proffitt: candidate for PA Senate 13th District

Mr. Proffitt spoke of his goals in running against Republican incumbent Scott Martin. He will:

- Take on big money in politics which has corrupted the system
- Provide to Americans an optimistic attitude of our ability to fix problems, not wallow in them
- Promote Democratic response to issues currently facing Americans:

rights for LGBTQ+ and transgender citizens gun safety regulation a fight against proliferation of drugs in our population job opportunities

Mr. Proffitt spoke of his goal to investigate what other states are doing that is working well to solve these issues.

General Meeting Minutes 09-25-2024

Jim Atkinson: candidate for U.S. House of Representatives, PA District 11, running against incumbent Lloyd Smucker.

Mr. Atkinson gave a brief background of what drew him to run in 2024 – a carjacking that left him with a serious bullet wound. He believes that 2024 is a crucial election year for all Americans. He spoke of two major issues which motivated him to run:

- gun violence and lax gun safety legislation
- the power of Big Pharma and big money in Washington, DC.

President Porter thanked our guest speakers for their time and information and encouraged attendees to support them as candidates in November. All three candidates were available for questions with individuals after the meeting.

Business Meeting:

Treasury/Membership: Julia Powers reported a balance of \$8,221.80 and a membership of 275 with 83 new members. President Porter announced the need for a new Membership Chair for 2025 and gave the job description for the position. Advocacy: Barbara Bonanno and President Porter gave the report.

Four postcard campaigns are complete

- Get Out the Vote to Lampeter-Strasburg residents with instructions for mail-in ballots (1,436)
- From *Grandmothers for a Brighter Future* to encourage votes for Bob Casey, mailed last week (1,000)
- More cards for Trex Proffitt will be available for volunteers. Please consider volunteering for this important work.
- "Post Cards to Swing States" will go out in October.

The phone call campaign for new members held July and August is complete with 37 forms sent to those interested in joining WV Dems+.

President Porter explained the new process for postcard distribution and collection. Team Leaders in each community will contact volunteers expressing interest in writing the cards which the Team Leader will distribute and collect. Concierges will no longer be involved. A signup sheet was available for those interested in serving as a Team Leader.

General Meeting Minutes 09-25-2024

President Porter announced that WV Dems+ needs a new webmaster for their site beginning in January 2025 and asked attendees to contact her if they or a family member may be interested.

The West Lampeter Fair is held September 25-27. All volunteer slots are filled.

Vice President Ross Fairweather will assume the distribution of the Club newsletter.

Following the business meeting, the floor was open for discussion with the three guest speakers. Questions arose about the possible weakening of plurality for Lloyd Smucker and the need to talk to friends and neighbors about the importance of voting in November.
